**N**icole S. Sampson of Setauket has been selected as a fellow of the American Chemical Society for her work “translating the mycobacterial cholesterol metabolism into drug targets and the development of precision polymer chemistry and probes to unravel receptor interactions in mammalian fertilization,” the society said. Sampson is a chemistry professor at Stony Brook University, where her lab focuses on understanding the relationship between protein structure and protein function and synthesizing chemical tools to understand and control biological functions. She has served as chair of the society’s Joint Board-Council Committee on Publications and as counselor for its Division of Biological Chemistry.
